The recent NGH Community Event featured talks from Duncan Hutt (Director of Conservation) and Graham Holyoak (Nature recovery Manager) at Northumberland Wildlife Trust.

Duncan is leading the project to purchase the Rothbury Estate and talked about the opportunities and challenges this presents.

Graham, who leads the Wilder Northumberland network, continued the nature recovery theme and gave examples from a range of locations across Northumberland showing how it's hoped that these will become part of a 40-mile wildlife corridor from the coast to the border.

The morning also included the Great Big Green Book Swap as well as lots of time for networking and sharing news and forthcoming events. It was great to see so many members and we're already looking forward to the next event!

2. Podcasting Opportunity



Podcasting Project Opportunity

NGH Member, Lesley Long, is in the early stages of exploring a climate and sustainability focused podcasting project with Dr Caroline Mitchell, Professor of Radio and Participation at University of Sunderland. Caroline, who is an active member of Climate Action Newbiggin and a member of NGH, has worked with a broad range of communities for many years on community radio and Lesley is a former communications trainer and Lionheart Community Radio presenter.

Caroline's current research is focused on developing sustainable participatory media practices and frameworks relating to communities, cultural participation, wellbeing, and sustainable development. Together with two members of Climate Action Newcastle, the working group are exploring the feasibility of creating a podcast addressing, climate, ecological and sustainability issues across Northumberland, Newcastle and locations south of the Tyne.

If you are new to podcasts here's a quick overview.

What is a Podcast?

- A podcast is a programme made available in digital format for download over the Internet and listened to or watched on various devices. It's essentially a "radio show" you can listen to on demand, anytime, anywhere.

Podcasts Can...

- *Reflect Passions*: No matter the topic, people are turning to podcasts to discover their passions and find their tribe. As a result, podcasts wield significant influence, particularly in shaping audience trust and engagement.
- *Foster Trust and Engagement*: Podcast hosts' voices and personalities build trust, as listeners feel a closer connection compared to traditional media or social media personalities.
- *Build Communities*: Podcasts foster a sense of community among listeners, creating a platform for shared interests and experiences.
- *Educate & Inform*: Podcasts offer a more in-depth and engaging format compared to other media, allowing for complex discussions and detailed information.
- *Increase Accessibility*: The accessibility of podcasting empowers individuals from a host of backgrounds to share their voices and expertise, fostering a diverse range of perspectives.

Like to Get Involved?

The working title for the podcast is *The Eco Pod*. As the project progresses, the working group will be looking for contributors, interviewers, and anyone who might like to get involved in podcast production or

in creating a podcast for their own community group. Podcast experience is not necessary, as you may well have transferable skills in research, public speaking, interviewing, marketing, organising events, etc. Training will be provided.

Carbon and Nature Fund Launched

North East Mayor Kim McGuinness recently launched the North East Carbon and Nature Marketplace. Businesses and organisations can now invest in projects aimed at enhancing biodiversity, restoring habitats and reducing emissions.

The Marketplace is an online platform where buyers can invest in projects or purchase carbon credits. Projects include the North East Community Forest, Fare Share North East and Northumberland Community Energy.

River to be re-wiggled

The course of a 1km section of the River Breamish on the Harehope Estate, south of Wooler in Northumberland, will be re-routed this summer to reflect its traditional course.

Following years of straightening to create farmland, work is taking place to divert the river into its historic channels, installing shallow ponds, wetlands and new woody dams.

The Breamish restoration is expected to be completed by late summer, and is part of the River Till Restoration Strategy, named after the river the Breamish flows into. It's hoped the work will be completed later this year and should give a real boost to wildlife.

5. Live Well with Less

Apps for Community Sharing and Wasting Less

There are lots of ways to reduce waste, and here we're featuring three apps which allow users to connect with local communities and businesses to do just that!



Olio is a free sharing app for local communities, with a mission to reduce waste. From food to furniture to clothing.

The app connects neighbours and local businesses to share surplus food and other household items. It works by allowing users to list items they no longer need (like food nearing its sell-by date or unwanted household items) and then allowing others to request and pick them up.



Too Good To Go

The Too Good To Go app is a platform that allows users to purchase "Surprise Bags" of surplus food from local restaurants, cafes, and stores at a discounted price, helping to reduce food waste. These bags contain perfectly good food that would otherwise be thrown away due to being unsold or approaching its best before date.

Too Good To Go offers a variety of "Surprise Bag" options, including Supermarket Bags with grocery items, Cafe Bags with hot food or pastries, and Market Kitchen Bags. The content of each bag is a surprise, but it's always food that is still fresh and perfectly edible.



Freecycle is a free, grassroots platform where people can give away unwanted items and acquire pre-owned goods from their local community. It's essentially a virtual space for a local reuse network, aiming to keep usable items out of landfills.

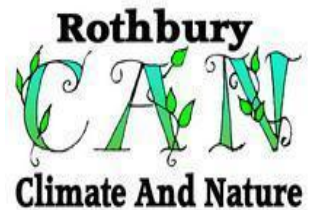

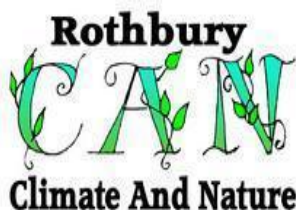

Branch Out and Plant Trees

The Tree Council has grants between £250 and £2500 for community groups to plant native trees, fruit trees and hedging. The Council will look, among other things, for evidence of strong community involvement, local relevant experience, engagement with young people and local sourcing of trees.

Early application is advised, with the final deadline midnight on Friday 14th November 2025 (note that funds may run out before that date). Planting must be completed by 15th March 2026.
